Queen Elizabeth II, UK's head of state, confirmed Theresa May as the new PM.

Theresa May has appointed Boris Johnson, the former London mayor who led the Brexit campaign, foreign secretary in her new aovernment.

Earlier, outside 10 Downing Street, after returning from Buckingham Palace where she was formally appointed prime minister by the Queen, Mrs May paid tribute to her predecessor David Cameron, who resigned after losing the EU Brexit referendum of June 2016. After his resignation, Mrs May was elected by the Conservative Party to succeed him.
